News from your Parish Council

Since the last newsletter in March 2013, there have been a number of changes at the Parish Council. In September, our Clerk Kirstin Saunders stood down from that position, and we welcomed Catherine Moore as our new Parish Clerk. In October, we received news that Councillor Nigel Tuck had resigned due to work commitments. The Parish Council would like to thank both Kirstin and Nigel for their support and help over the years, and to wish them well for the future. By the time you read this, the Parish Council may have co-opted a new Parish Councillor – more details in the next newsletter.

December is the time of year when the Parish Council considers its budget and sets its precept (the parish council's part of the council tax). This pays for things like grass cutting, wages and day to day running of the council. We have gone for a number of years with prudent budgeting and limited use of reserves, allowing small or no increase in precept. We have been encouraged by district and national government to do this. We are now in the position that we will have to consider an increase or 2014/15 to cover our budgeted expenditure. However the Parish Council's portion of the council tax is very small so this should not have a great overall effect on what you will pay.

The Parish Council continues to work on the issues that matter to you. Current projects include exploring options for solar powered flashing signs warning drivers of the location of the school (in partnership with Norfolk Council); and continued work around the Limpenhoe Village Green.

Our local MP Keith Simpson has agreed to attend our Parish Council Meeting on 20th March 2014 at 7pm at Cantley Village Hall. This is an unusual opportunity to meet your MP and speak about local issues together with the Parish Council, and we hope that you will take this opportunity to let us know what is important to you. Please put this date in your diary and come along and meet him.

Finally, residents are welcome to all Parish Council meetings (meeting dates above). There is an opportunity for public comment at the beginning of the meeting. If you are unable to make a meeting, you could instead email the Parish Clerk on cantleyparishcouncil@gmail.com.

Cantley Staithe

Cantley Staithe is on the river Yare and nestles between the Reedcutter Public House and the sugar factory. In the summer it is a lovely spot for a picnic or at this time of year a brisk walk along the river may be more appropriate, in either case you can have a drink next door at the Reedcutter.

There are seven moorings let to members of the local community. At present the annual charge is £400 with a 10% discount if you live in Cantley, Limpenhoe or Southwood. Mooring application forms are available from the website at www.cantley.org/staithe. Forms have to be submitted by 30th November each year. The Trustees allocate the moorings at their December meeting for the following year.

The Cantley Staithe Charitable Association is a registered charity. The Annual General Meeting is held in May and is advertised on the Parish Council notice boards. Dog Fouling

As the evenings become darker, the District Council receive an increase in dog fouling complaints. Most dog owners in our Parish are very considerate and clear up after their dogs. Thank you to all of those who do. We are still aware that a few people do not. It is not just unpleasant coming into contact with dog faeces but it also poses a risk to human health. Dogs that are not adequately wormed may contain parasitic eggs in their faeces, that if swallowed, can migrate through the human body and develop in the eye. This can lead to blindness and children are most at risk.
