An update from the Parish Churches

At St. Botolph, Limpenhoe, two members of the congregation have been trained to lead some services. This ensures that the pattern of two services a month (9.30am on 2nd and 4th Sundays) remains sustainable. It also means that services can take place in the parish on special occasions when priests are in demand, such as on Remembrance Sunday (10th November this year) and Christmas Eve Midnight. Harvest Thanksgiving will be celebrated at 10.30am on Sunday 13th October – all welcome.

At St. Margaret, Cantley, ten people attended an August service of Evening Prayer. Cantley Primary School continues to use the church; it is anticipated that Armistice Day will be marked as usual just before 11.00am on 11th November. Thank you to all involved in maintaining the churchyard, which remains open for burials and interments of ashes.

Bonfires

Now is the time of year that you may be working on your gardens and having a sort out. One way to clear some of the waste is to have bonfires. The Parish Council ask that if you are considering having a bonfire residents are thoughtful and respectful to their neighbours and try to ensure that the wind is blowing away from properties and that only materials which are dry are burned.
