PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

Many of you will now be aware that the 2017 beet campaign began on Monday 25th September. The crop this year has been very good and British Sugar have anticipating that processing will run into early March. To meet demand the factory will be running Sunday openings. As always British Sugar will ensure that the impact of their operations is minimised. Any issues with vehicles delivering to the factory should be reported to Ian Redhead, HSE Manager, 01493 724232.

The Parish Council has been advised that Network Rail will be undertaking significant engineering works on the Norwich-Yarmouth-Lowestoft lines between October 2017 and March 2019. Crossing keeper operated level crossing gates will be replaced with a modern barriers, which will be controlled by the Signaller using CCTV. Due to the nature of the work some disturbance is unavoidable. Network Rail will be holding a public drop in session on 31st January at Cantley Village Hall, between 11am – 1pm and 5pm – 7pm. The sessions are an opportunity to ask any questions you may have with regard to the programme of works.

Many of you will be pleased to see that Royal Mail have replaced the post box on Langley Road.

The Parish Council continues to meet on the third Thursday of the month, dates are shown above. All residents are welcome to attend, and time is set aside at the beginning of the meeting for any issues that members of the public may wish to raise. CANTLEY CHURCH UPDATE

Since the last newsletter there have been several developments relating to **Cantley Church.** The Diocesan Churches Trust has now taken on responsibility for St. Margaret's Church, however this does not affect use of the building. The Church has also been fitted with a roof alarm, which is remotely monitored, to deter metal thieves and it is good to hear that to date there have been no problems. NORSE continues to cut the paths and an area earmarked for future burials on a monthly basis. Several volunteers have also helped in cutting in certain areas. A complete cut of the rest of the churchyard has been arranged for December, with the Diocesan Churches Trust, which has now taken on the church building. Unfortunately the churchyard is too extensive for the Church or the Parish Council to manage as intensively as some people would like; but it is hoped that this year's cutting regime has provided an acceptable compromise.
